AFRL/RX Director's Message

Hi, I am the new RX Acting Director, Col Chuck Ormsby. In my first few months in the Materials and

Manufacturing Directorate, I have had the pleasure of meeting many of you. For those that I haven't yet met, I look forward to meeting you in the future. I'd like to take advantage of this opportunity to help you get to know me a little a bit better.

First, I am excited to be back in Dayton, Ohio and thrilled to be one of many outstanding leaders in the Materials and Col Charles Ormsby Manufacturing Directorate. Born



and raised in Terre Haute, Indiana, Wright-Patterson is as close to home as the Air Force will ever send me. It is exciting to finish my Active Duty career (I think) at the same base where it began, and just a few hours from home and family. I was commissioned in 1992 through the ROTC program at Rose-Hulman Institute of Technology, joined the Air Force to see the world and moved 200 miles across I-70 to Wright-Patterson. I started my career in what is now NASIC as a microelectronics materials analyst, sure wish I'd known more about the Materials and Manufacturing Directorate back then. I've had two assignments across the street at AFIT for both Master's and PhD degrees in electrical engineering. Along the way, I've had assignments in test at Holloman AFB, S&T at what is now AFRL/RD, MAJCOM requirements at HQ ACC and, just before coming here, 5 years in SAF/AQR overseeing Air Force S&T.

(AFRL/RX - A Century of Scientific Excellence continued)

The 100 year History Book is coming together nicely and will be published sometime in the beginning of 2017. No official date is set, but we will have a small event associated with handing out the book.

Mark your calendar for 9 June. We will be holding a picnic at Bass Lake as well as unveiling some sort of physical commemoration in front of Building 653. As part of the physical commemoration, we will bury a time capsule to be opened 50 years later, in 2067. We would like to gather ideas for items to include in this time capsule. Here are some factors to keep in mind:

- We do not want to include items that are in a digital format (i.e. DVDs, CDs, flash drives, etc.), since we don't know what will be compatible with technology in 50 years (Just to put it into perspective, 50 years ago, the VHS hadn't yet been invented).
- We want to include items that are representative of our identity and the present-day work we do.
- We need to be mindful of space limitations; we don't know yet what size the capsule will be, but think in terms of a very large shoebox.
- Finally, we want to make some predictions for the future of aerospace and materials technology, specifically what new developments will exist 50 years from now. We would like such predictions to be concise and easily readable. Once we receive these predictions, we may take the text and graphics (if any are provided) and create a mock newspaper article for 2067.

AFRL/RX Awards

The AFRL STEM Award for Manufacturing Technology was given to Ms. Rebecca Cleaver.

The AFRL Science and Engineering Early Career Award, first given in 2012, recognizes AFRL's most deserving scientists and engineers for significant research or engineering achievements during the on-set of their career. **Dr. Craig Przybyla** distinguished himself as a Materials Research Engineer in the Composites Branch, Structural Materials Division at the Materials and Manufacturing Directorate. His research in Integrated Computational Materials Science and Engineering for ceramic matrix composites (CMCs) resulted in transition of unique computational methodology to industry. His initiative and leadership has helped to shape a successful CMC behavior and life prediction strategy for the AFRL.

Dr. Rollie Dutton, the RXM division chief, was inducted as a Fellow of ASM International.

Lt Col Scott Fitzner was selected for the Middle Division Air Force Association Management Award.

Congratulations to **Dr. Rich Vaia** (RXA) and **Dr. Brandon Howe** (RXAN) for their teams' selections for STAR team designation by the Air Force Office of Scientific Research. Rich's team focuses on the Dynamics of High Pressure Shear Flows. Brandon's team focuses on Novel Epitaxial Magnetoelectric Heterostructures for Next Generation Tunable RF/microwave Components.

Kudo's to **Dr. Shekhar Guha** of RXAS for selection as a Fellow of The Optical Society, recognizing his work with nonlinear optical materials in visible and IR wavelengths.

Congratulations to **Dr. Lee Semiatin** on his selection for the TMS (The Minerals, Metals, and Materials Society) Bruce Chalmers Award. This is one of the society's BIG awards, previous recipients all being

giants in their respective fields.

A special shout out to **Dr. Rollie Dutton** who spearheaded the effort. His specific citation: For exceptional contributions to the science and engineering of thermomechanical processing of aerospace alloys, mentoring of young engineers, and technology transfer to industry"

The criteria:

- Must have an established record of research, publications, and/or patents in the field of materials processing.
- 2. Recognizes the quality and relevance of work that has had or is likely to have a significant and lasting impact on the development of the discipline.
- 3. May honor a single, significant achievement or a larger body of work.

Named in honor of Dr. Bruce Chalmers who was a professor of metallurgy and former master of John Winthrop House at Harvard University. Born and trained in London, Dr. Chalmers was a senior researcher in physics and atomic energy during and after World War II in Britain. He joined the Harvard faculty as Gordon McKay Professor of Metallurgy in 1953. Dr. Chalmers served as master of Winthrop House, an undergraduate residence, from 1964 to 1975. He retired in 1977 after 24 years as a professor in Harvard's division of engineering and applied sciences. Harvard University called him "an authority in the field of metallurgy."

THE RX EMBLEM: SYMBOLIC OF OUR DIRECTORATE AND MISSION

The gold circle of arrows projecting outwards signifies the extension of knowledge beyond present boundaries The three arrows represent materials research, application, and manufacturing technology. The inward pointing arrows portray the extensive efforts contributing to the



circle of knowledge. The emblem bears the Air Force colors, gold and ultramarine blue. Against a background of blue, depicting the sky, the primary theatre of the Air Force operations, the central atom represents the building block of all materials.
