SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION

Note: All applications must be submitted by May 1, 2026

The application must include the following information:

1. Essay

Write an essay that gives some background on where you are in your educational life, what you hope to accomplish in the next phase, and what your thoughts are for a future career.

While test scores are a factor in the overall evaluation for a scholarship, the evaluators regard an essay as an opportunity for the applicant to describe themselves, their educational background, their school experience, their aspirations for the future in terms of a career, and the way they feel they can best accomplish what they hope to achieve.

Explain why you have chosen the field of study you propose to follow and where you hope it will lead you. Describe what contributions you hope to make to that field. Add any additional information that you believe would help an evaluator to understand more about you and your abilities, in the context of your continuing education and ultimately a career.

There is no specific requirement for the length of the essay, though two pages is typical. Please submit it on pages separate from the application itself. Use of ChatGPT or other AI assistance when writing your essay is strictly prohibited.

2. Recommendation/character references

All applicants should provide two letters of recommendation that reflect academic, work and community activities. These recommendations should include the names, affiliation and contact information of the providers. These may be sent separately or included with the application, but they must be received by the due date. The providers should be informed that they may be contacted separately at the discretion of the review committee.

3. Evidence of academic performance and achievement

A minimum equivalent GPA of 3.0 on a scale of 4.0 is required. Provide a copy of a most-up-to-date full high school career transcript, along with evidence that graduation will occur in 2026. Include SAT and ACT test score reports, if available. Photocopies may be used. Transcripts provided separately must be submitted by May 1, 2026.

4. Awards, extracurricular and/or community service activities

Include relevant dates and average time spent at activities. If applicable, include any information on awards, accomplishments or other notable recognitions.

5. Statement of interest and intent

Provide a short statement of your educational intent towards a proposed degree or equivalent, as well as work plans following college/grad school.

6. Evidence of acceptance as a full-time student

Provide evidence of acceptance or enrollment in the equivalent of at least twelve semester credit hours in an accredited two- or four-year college or university

7. Completed Scholarship Applicant Information Form**Notes:**

The names and photographs of applicants who are awarded a scholarship may be published on the AFMMAA web site, as well as in any appropriate AFRL/RX publications.
